


New York Gallery Beat: Offbeat Summer Group Shows

"Staycation" at Ground Floor Gallery, through August 17.

Works in this cartography-themed summer show fall along the highway between figurative paintings of through-the-windshield road trip landscapes (Lindsey Warren) and geometric abstraction (Greg Slick). The most memorable works take a more psycho-geographic approach to the idea of mapping, particularly the free-associative paintings of Jose Arenas and Martin McCormack's amazing large-scale collage—a map of New York City cobbled together from various neighborhood maps. All the works are strong, but McCormack's huge meta-map is what makes this show a mustvisit during your New York City summer staycation. —Benjamin Sutton
